Update: Catholic Diocese Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and praying for peace

March 23, 2022

The Holy See has updated information concerning the Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine which is now taking place around 6:30 p.m. Rome time on March 25, 2022.

Bishop Michael F. Olson will celebrate Mass for the Solemnity of the Annunciation of Our Lord, Jesus Christ at Saint Patrick Cathedral at 12:05 p.m. on Friday, March 25, 2022. At the end of Mass, he will pray the Act of Consecration in communion with Pope Francis and all of the bishops around the world.

The Holy Father has asked that all Catholic bishops and priests around the world to join him in leading the faithful in praying the Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and praying for peace because of the war in Ukraine.
